

TOKEN IDENTIFICATION INDEX

Venezuelan tokens have many family and place names, words and denominations in common with those from their other Latin-American sister republics. The following list is made up of portions of the legends of the several tokens listed by Sr. Tomas Stohr. Typically the collector who finds any two of the legend names in this list on his token should be able to confirm a Venezuelan provenance for his piece.

Of course there are many more tokens of Venezuela not listed here, but this work can provide a beginning. Names below begin with the first letter in the legend as in "A. Zadra" below, rather than "Zadra, A." Denominations, numerals, etc. which do not identify the tokens have been left out unless they are the only legend on the token.
